A hazard is something that may cause harm or damage. The risk is the harm that may occur from the hazard. The leader will check weather before the event starts and tailor briefing to current conditions, eg, if icey, take extra care, and do not run. Event volunteers will advise participants on suitable clothing to wear and carry (including sun protection and waterproofs). Event volunteers will check that everyone's suitably equipped at the start of the meeting and have a few spare items available. A day pack containing drinks bottles, food and snacks as required. Leaders and event volunteers will monitor young people and return to the High School if it gets too hot or the weather deteriorates.	
Terrain : uneven ground, branches, nettles, cracks in pavements, trips over tables and chairs, slips on floor, cables etc.	Young people, leaders, Event Volunteers	Event volunteers will advise participants on suitable footwear and check everyone's footwear at the start, no sliders or open toed shoes.
