

If you're taking part in all of these amazing activities, you want something to prove that you've done them, right?

Badges and Awards are a huge part of Scouting, providing a framework of ideas for Leaders to follow and recognition to the young people for their achievements.

Core Awards

These include the Membership Award which you will receive when you get invested as a Scout and make your promise; it features a fleur de lis, an international symbol worn by Scouts around the world. There are also the Moving On and Joining In Awards which you receive for continuing your Scouting journey.

Peer Leadership Stripes

These are awarded to young people who take on a leadership role within their patrol, as an Assistant Patrol Leader, Patrol Leader or Senior Patrol Leader.

Activity Badges

There are 59 Activity Badges, covering everything from Angling to Writing. We will complete some of these badges at Scouts but you can also do your favourites at home! If there is a badge you would like to complete at Scouts, just let us know and we'll try to include it in the programme.

Staged Activity Badges

There are 15 of these badges, which are similar to the Activity Badges, but they have stages with increasing levels of difficulty. You can start working on these as a Beaver and they remain on your uniform until you leave Explorers.

Challenge Awards

There are 9 Challenge Awards which lead up to the Chief Scout's Gold Award (page 12). These are more difficult to achieve, so we will work towards them at Scout's but there may be some homework too!




To earn this you need to have completed six activity or staged activity badges of your choice and all nine of the Challenge Awards.

Where My Badges Go



Scout Uniform

What is the Scout Uniform?

For most meetings, Scouts should wear the teal green shirt or blouse, clean, ironed and with their badges sewn on neatly. Scouts should also wear their necker, ironed, neatly rolled and secured with their patrol woggle.

For regular meetings Scouts should wear trousers which look neat with the Scout shirt tucked in (e.g. jeans, walking trousers, school trousers, skirts). Smart trousers (school or uniform) are expected for ceremonies and public events.

For certain activities we may ask Scouts to wear something more appropriate, but we will let you know when this is the case.

Where can I buy uniform?

Uniform can be purchased online from the Scout Store or Amazon. Sometimes parents may choose to pass on an old uniform at a reduced cost or for free, so it's worth asking.

What else do I need?

This will largely depend on the activities we do, but things like a good waterproof coat and sturdy pair of walking boots will come in handy. A separate kit list will be provided when we go camping.

The Scout Store also offers uniform items such as belts and hoodies, but these are not compulsory.



The Scout Promise

For Muslims

In the name of Allah, the Most Beneficial and the Most Merciful, I promise that I will do my best to do my duty to Allah and to the King, to help other people and to keep the Scout Law.

For Christians, Jews and Sikhs

On my honour,
I promise that I will do my best
to do my duty to God
and to the King,
to help other people
and to keep the Scout Law.

For Hindus and Buddhists

On my honour, I promise that I will do my best to do my duty to my Dharma and to the King, to help other people and to keep the Scout Law.

For humanists, atheists and those with no defined faith

On my honour, I promise that I will do my best to uphold our Scout values, to do my duty to the King, to help other people and to keep the Scout Law.

For subjects of independent Commonwealth countries, foreign nationals and individuals who are stateless the following wording can replace 'duty to the King'

...to do my duty to the country in which I am now living.







The Scout Law

- 1. A Scout is to be trusted.
- 2. A Scout is loyal.
- 3. A Scout is friendly and considerate.
- 4. A Scout belongs to the worldwide family of Scouts.
- 5. A Scout has courage in all difficulties.
- 6. A Scout makes good use of time and is careful of possessions and property.
- 7. A Scout has self-respect and respect for others.

The Scout Promise and Law give a distinctive ethos to the practices of our Movement and act as a bond with Scouts in other countries.

You will make your Promise when you get invested (officially join the Troop and receive your first badges and necker) but don't worry about learning it off by heart just yet!

We meet every **Tuesday** from **19:30- 21:00**.

It costs **£17 per month**, payable by Direct Debit. This covers:

- Capitation fees to District, County and National levels
- Group fees to cover bills, insurance, equipment, the hut, etc.
- Costs of activities and equipment
- Group Camp, held in September

We are one of the few groups in the UK who can wear a Red, White and Blue Necker, with a story dating back to 1917!

There is a joining fee which is a one off cost of £16 when you first join the group (i.e. you do not need to pay this if you are moving up from Cubs).

This is paid when you are invested and covers the necker and initial badges you receive.





Scouts is what you make it. It can be a foundation for a well rounded life including diversity and adventure. The possibilities are literally endless. That is why we have a huge focus on Youth Shaped Scouting, essentially letting you take control of your Scouting experience.

We will provide you with a platform to choose the activities you would like to do, the badges you would like to complete, the places you would like to go, all we ask from you is to take those opportunities and run with them. If there is something you want to do then we will do our best to find a way, so long as you are willing to match our enthusiasm.

There will also be opportunities to take on peer leadership roles, help to run a Patrol or plan and run parts of the programme. We will be there to facilitate you the whole way, preparing you with skills you will use for the rest of your life.

#SkillsForLife

When you join almost half a million other young people who are members of the Scout Association in the UK, you are joining one big family. Within this family we have multiple tiers, starting at a UK national level and branching into Regional, County, District, Group and Section levels.

1st C&A Scouts are the Scout section within the 1st C&A Group, who all meet at the hut on Depot Corner. We are part of the South West Notts District, and will occasionally attend events or camps with the ten other groups in the District, allowing you to make even more friends.

There are then nine Districts who make up the Nottinghamshire Scout County. The County Team provide support to members, but on a wider scale than the District Team, and will run larger scale events in Nottinghamshire. This structure enables Scouting to be tailored to each group, while maintaining the same overall goal.
